Weston CARES Fund Announces Phase 3

The Weston CARES Fund was established in April 2020 to address the needs of families and non-profits who serve them in Weston and neighboring towns who are experiencing housing and food shortages resulting from the COVID 19 pandemic.

To date, the WCF has raised nearly \$195K and has supported 83 families and 32 non-profits with those funds. Originally, the money raised was allocated with 60% going to non-profits and 40% to individuals/families. The Steering Committee has discovered that many more families are in need of assistance so they have decided to allocate 100% of all monies raised beginning May 25 to only families and individuals. During this final phase of the Fund's operation, this will allow the WCF to help more nearby families who often have nowhere else to turn for assistance.
